FROM THE HEAD

And just like that, the summer term comes to a close — and what a term it's been! I've loved seeing the school in full flow these past few weeks: sun-soaked, buzzing with energy, and packed with moments that capture the best of Cranleigh Prep life.

Thank you to all who came to Prize-Giving, which was a lovely way to round off the year in a gorgeous-looking marquee. The 6th Form Leavers' Ball certainly made great use of it the following day as well! There was a huge amount of work done behind the scenes to create such a wonderful space and enable the event to run so seamlessly: my thanks to everyone involved, and at every level.

Jeremy Reid steps into Head of Year 8 and he is replaced in Year 6 by Simon Weaver.








COLOURING CLUB








FORM 3 POETRY

SPORTS ROUNDUP

Last Friday and Saturday saw our two Sports Days. As a culmination of the year's sporting endeavours, it is always one of my true highlights. This year saw an added complication that the expected heat might make some events, or even a whole day, untenable. The health and well-being of the pupils will always trump the disappointment of those whose events might have been curtailed, but nonetheless it was a decision I was not looking forward to making. Fortunately, with careful planning and slightly overcast skies, both Friday and Saturday ran without a hitch and there were some truly stellar performances. Nine school records were broken and a number of others were also incredibly close to going.







Our U11 boys' cricket team travelled to Whigift in the Surrey Cup Semi Final and narrowly lost to a very strong team. We weren't able to quite get out their best batsman, who went on to get 92* of their 132 runs. In reply, all of our boys batted well, but ultimately just came up short. Such an incredible season from this group of players.

Our girls' 1st XI were also into the ESCA Hardball cup semi finals and with time running out, we were able to manufacture all of the semi finalists to join us at Cranleigh for a Finals Day. It fills me with pride that they prevailed and we are now the Surrey U13 Champions!

Alongside this mammoth day of cricket, we also hosted 11 regular cricket matches and travelled to Aldro, St Edmunds and Hoe Bridge for another nine. It was a lovely way for Form 6 to finish their sporting time at CPS.

Thursday once again allowed us to mix our Form 1 and 2 boys and girls when we played Aldro. The social benefit that they all received, along with the stretch and challenge of playing with children of different ages, makes this school a very special place to watch the children play sport. The Aldro staff commented that it is something that they are going to try and do more of moving forwards.




